# **Anxiety of High School Students Preparing for University during the COVID-19 Pandemic**

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### **ABSTRACT**

Covid-19 are one of the viruses that were widely spreaded in 2019 and are still separate until nowadays. Thailand is one of the countries that are highly infected. The majority of people who are infected with this virus tend to have mild to severe respiratory symptoms. Furthermore, anyone can get sick, and it can lead to death. However, the most common symptoms of this virus are fever, cough, tiredness, and loss of taste or smell, on the other hand, characteristics in a minority of people, such as diarrhea and headaches. Due to the impact of the Covid-19 virus, people have to change their lifestyle to the online form. These changes have impacted mostly on economics and education in particular countries, so this problem also affects anxiety among high school students; who must prepare to apply to the university during the COVID-19 outbreak. In addition, we have collected 151 answers from high school students by surveying in order to know the feelings for entrance to the university during the pandemic situation. We found out that 81.3% of the students are highly affected by covid, and only 0.7% of students are slightly affected. We also found out that 55% of the students are worried about university entrance, and only 2.6% of the students were not worried at all. According to the result, most of the students in Thailand are facing the problem about their education and their entrance for the university which are caused by Covid-19. This may lead to illnesses like depression and anxiety.

They'll inquire how much of an impact COVID-19 has had on Thai education and how well you're prepared for additional courses. Is there going to be a question in the second part? Are you influenced by COVID-19's online learning? Does the problem you're having have an impact on your university admissions chances, and does studying online have an impact on your GPA?

# **RESULT**

From the questionnaire "Anxiety of High School Students and Preparing for University" During the COVID-19 Pandemic." Total 151 respondents, divided into grades in descending order, Grade 12 55 students, Grade 11 31 students and Grade 10 65 students. It can be seen that Grade 10 students have the highest number of survey respondents. In some schools, there is a

division of study plan, which is divided according to preferences and chosen according to the faculty that will enter the university. Divided into Science-Mathematics 94 students, Art-Calculation 33 students, and Arts-Language 24 students.

# **DISCUSSION**

A research study of 151 high school students revealed the concerns and readiness of Thai students to prepare for university studies. The goals the students choose to study and based on the survey results was found that most of the students had stress and anxiety about going to university, it was also found that most of them were less readily available for the further education due to many factors and also counting the impact of online learning during COVID-19 pandemic whether it was physical or mental health. This is because of the misunderstanding of the lessons and the Prapattra Hongwisat et.al. Anxiety of high school students preparing for university during the COVID-19 pandemic.

problem of heavy workloads that causes students to not have enough time to prepare for university. These affect the grade point average of students and result in scores not being as expected and causing stress. At this point, this can be solved by managing the workload without affecting the time of the students, and there should be help from both the public and private sectors in adjusting the teaching style to suit the students to reduce problems arising from stress and other health problems as mentioned.

# **CONCLUSION**

Of the 151 high school students using a questionnaire survey, the majority of students are anxious about further education at college. This was caused by many problems, including unresponsive grades, spending time on heavy workloads instead of preparing for university. These incidents are caused by the problem of the spread of Covid 19 that lead to many changes in the

education system, and all of this can be the result of stress and other diseases that follow. Therefore, there should be a solution from both the public and private sectors regarding the scoring model that does not fit the situation and workload which have taken up most of the time.
